Bidding No-Trump (NT)

Opening 1 NT is easy to figure out; responding to your partner's 1 NT opener isn't so easy (and you become the Captain of the hand). Review the requirements of both actions in the tables below

Opener's Requirements for 1NT	Responder's Requirements to a 1NT opener
16 – 18 High Card Points (HCP)	Do you have points for game? 9+ required then bid 3NT
At least 2 cards in every suit	Do I want to be in NT or a Major? What is the shape of your

When Partner opens 1NT and you have a 5 card Major and 9+ HCP, respond with a 3 ♥ (or 3 ♠) bid. Partner will decide whether to stay in NT or bid your Major suit if he has 3+ (Golden fit). With a 6 card Major, bid 4 ♥ (or 4 ♠). You have the Golden fit because Partner's 1NT bid has promised 2 in every suit.
